In case of difference in interpretation, school administrators will render decisions that are lawful, fair, and in the best interests of CDCS. CDCS reserves the right to change policies and procedures at any time without notice. The handbook does not constitute a contract between CDCS and the student/parent, and CDCS reserves the right at its discretion to change or amend the handbook at any time in the future.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Coram Deo Classical School is to train our children in the knowledge and wisdom of the Lord, and to educate them in a historic Christian worldview through a rigorous classical curriculum.

PURPOSE

The purpose is to train children in the classical method with a Biblical worldview in the presence of God, under the authority of God, to the glory of God. Coram Deo Classical is a tutorial program designed to help parents teach their children by doing the lesson planning, objectively evaluating their student's work, and teaching through discovery and discussion.

GOALS

Coram Deo Classical School encourages every family and student to develop a love for learning and to reach academic potential set by the parents, teachers, and mature students. CDCS seeks to integrate Scripture throughout all subject areas while respecting the primary discipleship role that belongs to the family. We consider it a privilege to partner with parents in the educational goals of their children.

PHILOSOPHY

It is our conviction that God's Word, the Bible, is inspired, inerrant, sufficient and authoritative. This conviction drives us to shape our educational philosophy solely on the basis of what God's Word has to say about a subject instead of what the current trend may be. Our belief that all of life's questions can be answered by the truth found in the Bible causes us to carefully study Scripture in light of its context and history. A high view of God leads us to vividly see our own sinfulness and our ultimate dependence on Him. We rely on God to provide us with a way to be found favorable in His sight, which He provided through the death of His son, Jesus Christ.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

- We believe the Bible to be the inspired and the only infallible authoritative Word of God. (*II Tim. 3:16; II Pet. 1:21*)
- We believe that there is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (*Gen. 1:1; John 10:30; John 10:37-38*)
- We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His vicarious and atoning death through His shed blood, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and in His personal return in power and glory. (*Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:23; Luke 1:35; Heb. 4:15; Heb. 7:25; John 2:11; Heb. 9:12; Col. 1:14; John 11:25; Acts 1:11; Rev. 10:11-16*)
- We believe that man is sinful by nature and that regeneration by the Holy Spirit is essential for his salvation. (*Rom. 3:10, 23; John 3:16-19; John 5:24; Eph. 2:8-10; Titus 3:5, 6*)
- We believe in the continuing ministry of the Holy Spirit, by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a Godly life. (*Eph. 5:18; Eph. 4:30; I Cor. 3:16; I Cor. 6:19-20*)
- We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ. (*Rom. 8:9; I Cor. 12:12-13; Gal. 3:26-28*)
- We believe in the creation of man by the direct act of God. (*Gen. 1:26-28, Gen. 5:1-2*)

LEADERSHIP

The Coram Deo Classical School Board of Directors and the administration are planning and praying concerning improvements of the program. We hope more families become convinced of the necessity and advantages of a classical, Christ-centered, parent collaborating education. CDCS is a non-profit incorporated in the State of Georgia. The Board of Directors governs our school under the Word of God, its adopted by-laws, and its statements of faith, mission, purpose and goals. The Board of Directors is comprised of individuals committed to the principles and purpose of our school. The administration of school operation is under the oversight of the Officers of the Board, the Principal, and competent administrative staff.

ACCREDITATION & TRANSCRIPTS

Coram Deo Classical School has obtained accreditation status through the Georgia Accrediting Commission (GAC) under our nameplate "**Coram Deo Classical School**". This accreditation allows students who meet the academic requirements to qualify for the HOPE scholarship program of Georgia. The accreditation is also recognized by all colleges and universities.

- **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

Please note that students intending to graduate from Coram Deo Classical School must meet the graduation requirements set forth by the Georgia Accrediting Commission. It is the responsibility of the parents to ensure that the student has met all of these course requirements. CDCS high school instructors can assist you in determining your student's graduation requirements. At the end of the school year, CDCS will host a graduation ceremony to honor our seniors. This ceremony is typically held during the last week of the school year.

- **TRANSCRIPTS**

Coram Deo Classical School is able to offer students official school transcripts.* These assist students tremendously in transferring into a traditional school setting and/or applying to colleges. For most students, enrollment in Coram Deo Classical School for one full school year is required to receive an official completed transcript. There are many different ways that a student may earn credit that will be placed on their transcript. The following are some general guidelines that may apply. Please seek further advice from our principal and designated staff in charge of transcription and proctoring. There may be additional fees required to have your student's work officially transcribed.

In general, a student who has a transcript with CDCS will be taking classes offered by Coram Deo Classical School. There are some instances when a student can get credit for a class not taken at Coram Deo. To obtain credit for a subject that is/was not taught at Coram Deo Classical School or at another accredited school:

1. The student must be currently enrolled in a minimum of 2 core classes at CDCS. Please contact adviser for current policies.
2. The parent or tutor must submit the following credentials:
 - Years of post-High School Education
 - Major Area of study in college
3. The parent or tutor must submit the following information regarding the subject being taught:
 - The name of the textbook
 - The publisher of the textbook
 - The specific material studied

4. Each semester, two tests (the mid-term and final exams) must be proctored by a faculty member from CDCS. These tests will be graded by the parent or tutor, and the grade will be submitted at the time of the test. The parent or tutor will determine the final grade given.**
5. A student, either through class time or homework, must accumulate 75 hours per semester.
6. In the case of an elective, for example music or piano, and Physical Education, 75 hours must be logged by the student and verified by a music teacher or coach. The student must show improvement verified by the coach and must have participated in competition (tournament, race, or recital) in lieu of a skills test.

** If you choose to enter public high school with a CDCS transcript, you might be required to take End of Course exams for the transcribed classes.*

*** When a student desires to obtain credit for a core class not taken at CDCS, but that is offered by CDCS, the final will be provided by CDCS staff. A study guide for this final will be given to the student upon request. The final grade for the proctored class will be determined by preset percentages for homework, midterm, and final test. See the adviser for specifics.*

ATTENDANCE

A student enrolled in CDCS is expected to be present and on time in school every day school is in session. The actual number of days school is in session will be determined by the yearly school calendar. Students are also expected to attend and complete all requirements for every course in which the student is enrolled. Due to the limited number of in class days, it is vitally important to each student's progress to attend each class day and period. Please use the ample time in the non-class days to schedule personal activities (i.e. dentists, etc.).

1. Short –term absences: If a student needs to be absent from school for a day, for any reason, the parents should contact the teachers affected as soon as possible (prior to the absence). Absences will be excused due to student illness or family travel or an emergency, but the teacher must be contacted BY THE PARENT prior to the absence for it to be considered excused. Even though an absence may be excused, the work assigned is NOT, and is due immediately upon return with no penalty. The teacher and/or principal may excuse work from an absence from home, even if all CDCS class periods are attended. This must be communicated with the teacher and/or principal PRIOR to the class day that the work would have been due.
2. Long-Term Absences: If a student needs to be absent for two or more consecutive days, the parents should notify the teachers in writing (email) explaining the circumstances. This will allow the teachers to compile the necessary schoolwork, which the student would otherwise miss. Notification should be made as soon as possible to limit amount missed schoolwork.
3. Extended Absences: We will cooperate with families taking their children from school for family or other non-illness reasons. However, when extended absences are voluntary (versus emergency or illness) we expect schoolwork to be completed, or at minimum coordinated PRIOR to the absence. We recommend that prior to any planned, extended

absence, the students work ahead as much as possible. This eliminates both the need to work on vacation or doing a significant amount of make-up work.

4. **Maximum Absences:** If the total number of absences (excused or unexcused) totals four class days for the semester, the student may not receive credit for that time period. This means that 3 days for the semester is the maximum number of days will be permitted for a passing grade. In the event the total number of absences, whether planned or unplanned, exceeds five days in one semester, the students will not receive credit for that semester.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

Please drop your children off at school no more than 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. CDCS is not responsible for students dropped off for school more than 15 minutes before the scheduled start time. Please do not allow a student to be present at CDCS without faculty present. Please notify the teacher if you will be more than 10 minutes late to pick up a child, or if there are any unusual car pool changes. Please be considerate of the teacher and staff. If a child is repeatedly left late at school, there will be a monetary fee charged.

BEHAVIOR

Coram Deo Classical School students are expected to honor God, their parents, their country, their instructor(s), and their fellow students, according to biblical principles of conduct.

CDCS students are expected to act respectfully, honorably, honestly, and with integrity at all times and in all situations.

Unless otherwise indicated by the instructor, no one is to speak in class except the instructor or the student called upon to speak by the instructor.

Food may be eaten only in designated areas during breaks and during lunch period. Plastic bottles with water (only) may be kept on the student's table for sipping during class time.

Students are expected to act respectfully toward all church/school staff, student facilities, and property.

CDCS students are expected to arrive on time, have all assignments completed, and be prepared to participate in each class. Failure to do so is a discipline issue.

In all areas of our lives, no matter our ages, respectful behavior towards others (or lack thereof) is a character quality that will define us. As we strive to come alongside the parents in molding the hearts of our students, the Coram Deo teachers have a few areas that we will treat as specific discipline issues.

Every student will respect the teachers and all adults, their schoolmates (younger or older), and the property of others. Practically speaking this means: having the proper demeanor towards teachers, adults, and other students, and it means leaving others' property alone. This allows no room for unkind words to anyone, arguing with a teacher, stealing, lying, picking on others, cheating, etc.

Students and parents will be notified of discipline issues by the issuance of a "Discipline Slip". A copy of this slip will be given to the student. This form should be signed by the parent and returned the next week. Another copy will be kept on record with the school so that the number of occurrences can be tracked.

The kind and amount of discipline (correction) will be determined by the teachers, school directors and if necessary, the Board of Directors. The discipline will be administered in the light of the student's problem and attitude. All discipline will be based on biblical principles, e.g. restitution, apologies (public and private), restoration of fellowship, no lingering attitudes, etc. The vast majority of discipline problems are to be dealt with at the classroom level. Love and forgiveness will be an integral part of the discipline of a student. Parents and students must act in a godly, respectful manner toward students and instructors. The Word of God as found in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and the Ten Commandments are the standard used to evaluate conduct.

For the 9th – 12th grade specifically:

- Driving to and from school is a privilege (Rom. 13:1) and can be removed.
- There will be no public displays of affection (Ecc. 3:1). This will be brought to the parents' attention on the first offense.
- Profane or unkind words are not acceptable (James 3:9-10) and will be disciplined appropriately and brought to the parents' attention.
- Immodest dress will have to be changed or covered (I Tim. 2:9). Immodesty will be covered by oversized clothing until a change of clothes is brought. The student will attend class all day even if different clothes are never brought. A driving student will not be able to leave school to change clothes. Records will be kept of modesty and dress code violations.
- Disrespect and complaining will not be tolerated (Rom. 13:7) and will be disciplined appropriately and brought to the parents' attention.
- Work assigned will be completed by the due date (Colossians 3:23). Late work will be subject to points removed.

BOOKS

All classes have an associated book list so that you may obtain copies of these books by borrowing them or purchasing them used. Please make sure to get the correct edition and ISBN. This is of extreme importance. There is a supply fee due that covers class material other than text books. Please see the website for exact amounts and to obtain booklists.

CLASS SCHEDULE

School Administration determining each students' teacher and class schedule based on a variety of logistical factors. This will be published on the website as soon as it has been determined for the upcoming year. Most classes meet on Tuesday or Wednesday each week.

COMMUNICATION ETIQUETTE

Remember the old adage, "sticks and stones may break my bones but words will never hurt me? It's really not true, is it? Words can hurt us, but they can also encourage, console, instruct, and heal. Simply put, words are powerful instruments we have at our disposal to build one another up (I Thes. 5:11) or to tear one another down (James 3:9-10).

Good, truthful and wholesome communication between the teachers and parents of Coram Deo is going to be vitally important to the children's education. Because we "Share" the teaching that goes on from day to day, we must all strive to maintain humble and open avenues of communication. In the course of any school year, issues will inevitably come up that need to be talked through.

While Coram Deo is not a church, we are a group of Christians seeking to honor God in all that we do. Knowing this, we want to use the Bible as a guideline for our conversations.

In Matthew 18, it says:

15 "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. 16 But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. 17 If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. (ESV)

In Matthew 18: 15 – 17, we see the pattern churches are given to deal with sin. We want to apply this general pattern in our day to day school life and conversations. This is also how we will encourage the students, with our oversight, to deal with each other - honestly, forthrightly, and dealing with issues big or small in a timely manner. This helps to cut out gossip and slander of others, and it strengthens relationships.

For example, if you come across a situation where you and someone else disagree (for example, parent to teacher), work together to come to an agreement on the issue. If that doesn't happen, please let the principal help out.

Also, if someone has truly offended you in any way (a student, teacher or a parent), let's go to them first to try to reconcile the situation. As we kindly, but truthfully, talk the situation through,

hopefully the issue can be resolved. If reconciliation isn't possible, though, thankfully we're not stuck here. Again, at this point, please bring the issue to the attention of the principal.

CHEATING POLICY

Every student who cheats on an assignment or test should know that he has been “caught” by God whether his parents/teachers find out or not.

- For a first offense, the student will be given a zero. The zero will be averaged into his grade. For most students, this will cause failure of the class. If he has a chance of still passing class, he may stay in class.
- For a second offense, the student will be removed from class with a failing grade.
- For a third offense, the student will be removed from the school with the understanding that the parent is still responsible to pay for classes until the end of that semester.

***Note:** cheating events are tallied across all classes; not in single classes only. For example, if a student cheats in math this is a first offense. If they cheat in history, then that counts as a second offense. Cheating again, in any class, then counts as a third offense. Cheating will be defined clearly in each classroom so that there are no misunderstandings about something that so offends God.*

DISCHARGE from SCHOOL

CDCS reserves the right to ask a student to leave the school at the end of a semester if there have been repeated violations in areas of discipline. In this case, the parent realizes that tuition for the current semester will still be paid in full.

DRESS CODE

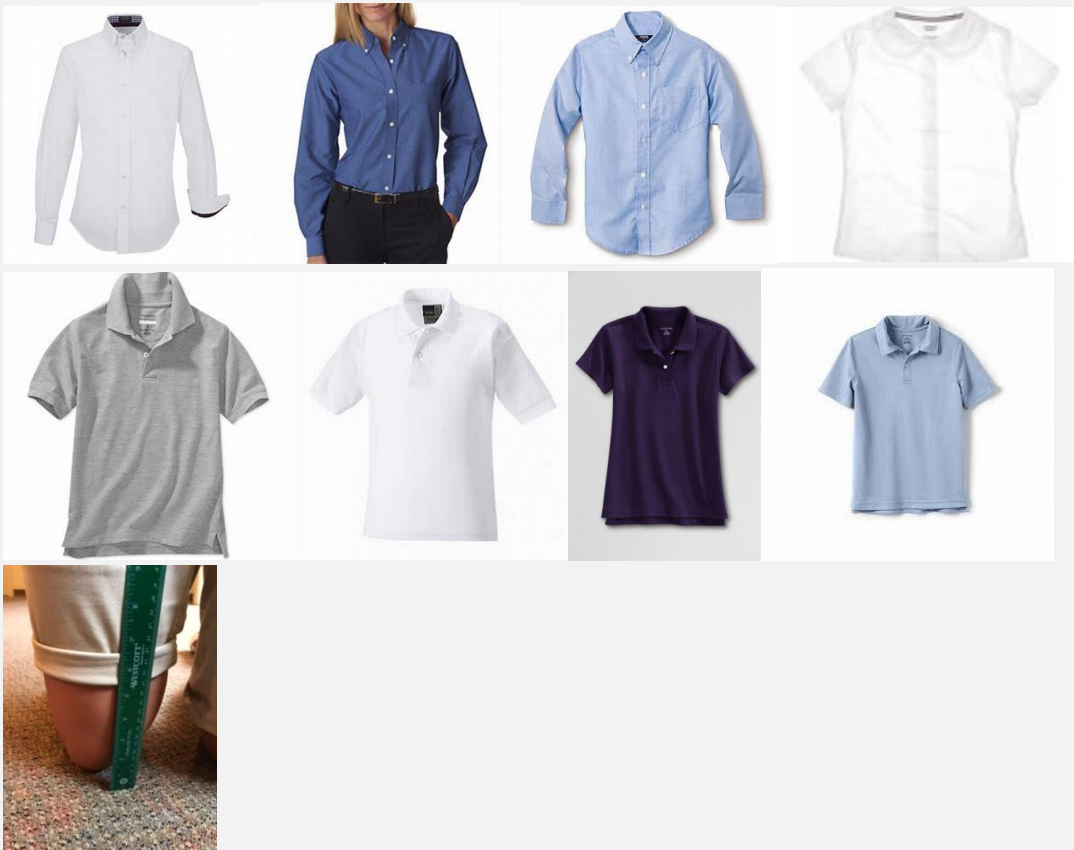
Students will dress according to the dress code except on special days as designated by each teacher or principal. Student’s appearance should display a desire to honor God. What a privilege!

- **Tops**
Boys and Girls: The colors of **polo** style shirts are: *white, navy, light blue, black or grey* long or short sleeves.
Students may also wear **traditional button down oxford** uniform shirts in solid *white, French blue or oxford blue*. High School students may wear CDCS T-shirts to Wednesday classes with uniform bottoms. Traditional shirts have a button down collar. *Any logo on polo shirts or outerwear must be small.*

- **Bottoms**

Boys: The colors of slacks or shorts will be khaki, navy or black. Shorts must not be any shorter than 6" from the ground when kneeling.

Girls: The colors of bottoms will be khaki, navy, black or school plaid. School plaid skirts or jumpers may be worn with white "Peter-pan" shirts, polos or oxford button down collar shirts. Skirts/dresses/jumpers need to fall at the top of the knee or below. Appropriate length would be no shorter than 2-4" from the ground when kneeling. Shorts need to fall no more than 6" from the ground when kneeling. Skinny style pants must have a top that completely covers the hip area. No undergarments may ever be visible. No legging style pants are to be worn unless they are under a skirt, dress or jumper.



- **Outerwear**

Sweat shirts, sweaters and jackets that are worn in the classroom must be in solid colors: white, navy, grey or black. CDCS sweatshirts may be worn.

- **Shoes**

Closed toe shoes with backs are appropriate (tennis shoes, boat shoes, dress shoes, boots, ballet flats) No sandals, crocs, house shoes, or flip flops allowed. This policy is in place for insurance purposes.

- **Jewelry/Accessories**

Should be modest and tasteful, enhancing part of the outfit. Girls may wear two pair of ear studs. No body piercing or gauges are allowed for boys or girls. Accessories including socks, leggings, tights, scarves, & hair bows must be in uniform colors.

- **Hair/Hats**

No unnatural hair colors are allowed for girls or boys.

Hairstyles should be well kept and tasteful.

No hats or beanies will be worn in the building for girls or boys unless it is a special dress costume day.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

We will notify by email at 6:00 am on class days if classes are to be cancelled for weather. We do not follow the local school district decisions.

LATE WORK POLICY

Assignments will be turned in at the appropriate time during class. Incomplete assignments will not be accepted. This may be at beginning of the class period.

1. Excused Late Work: Work will be turned in on the NEXT class day attended after an excused absence with no penalty. It is the responsibility of the student to coordinate with the teacher concerning in-class tests that were missed due to an excused absence.
2. Unexcused Late Work: Refer to the teacher's syllabus for individual teacher policies. Teachers set individual policies regarding late work.

LUNCHES

Students must bring their own lunches and drinks. The High School will have access to a microwave but all others must bring a cold, sack lunch. Please provide your child with a convenient water bottle so that the children can stay hydrated. Students are expected to respect and obey the lunch monitor. Parents occasionally will be asked to help monitor lunches.

PARENT HELP

There are many ways that we will need your help throughout the year. Each family takes turns serving with the lunch monitor in order to save on our costs. If you utilize study hall, you may be asked to help with monitoring the children on a rotation basis. We need chaperones for field trips, helpers for planning events, volunteers to organize graduation and other events, helpers with standardized testing, etc. There are many opportunities to be involved. Volunteer committees will be set up. Parents will also be asked to plan and participate in school events held every fall and spring, and sometimes around the holidays.

SCHOLASTIC PROBATION

Scholastic probation means that students are subject to academic review for a stated length of time, for a semester, or in some cases for an entire year. Their progress or lack thereof will be

monitored and reviewed by the appropriate teacher (s) and school principal. Policies concerning late work will be strictly followed.

Students may be placed on scholastic probation for a variety of reasons:

- Incoming 8th graders may be placed on probation because of their 7th of grade teacher(s) suggestion. This suggestion would be due to 7th grade work indicating they are not completely ready for high school preparation level work.
- Students will be placed on probation in the 8th-12th school years if a subject average drops below 71 in a semester.

Parents will be notified via email in the event that their student has been placed on probation. Communications will help define parental efforts to improve the student's performance in the class.

A parent will need to attend at least one class.

At the end of the probationary period, the administration will review the student's performance and take one of three possible courses of action:

- Remove the student from probation.
- Extend the period of probation.
- Discharge the student from CDCS.

Remember that if the student is removed from the school, the parent is still responsible for paying tuition for that semester according to the tuition contract.

SENIOR STUDENT FINALS POLICY

Seniors at CDCS, your consistent academic achievement and good attitude will be recognized. If a student has a 93 or above final average in a class you MAY have the opportunity to omit your final exam. Your teacher will let you know by May 1st if you are eligible for this privilege. The teachers will consider grades, absences and tardiness, and overall attitudes. You may only omit a maximum of two final exams. Certain classes may not be able to omit a final because of accreditation requirements.

SICK STUDENT POLICY

If your child has had a fever, has vomited, or has had another contagious illness within 24 hours of class time, please keep them at home with you so that others will not be exposed.

STANDARDIZED TESTING

Each year, Coram Deo offers the *Stanford Achievement Test*. Qualified testers give the test to all who would like to participate (including siblings). We charge "cost" for the test. Parents are needed to help with testing, monitor halls, provide snacks, and watch the testers. The test is usually in late September or early October.

VALEDICTORIAN/SALUTATORIAN/HONOR

Valedictorian/Salutatorian Qualifications:

Student must be Full Time Diploma student at Coram Deo Classical School (CDCS) and must have complied with the CDCS Code of Honor throughout high school.

Student must be on track to complete at least 18 credits at CDCS. Student is required to complete at least 23 credits to graduate. ***Only students who meet this qualification are eligible to be considered for valedictorian or salutatorian; however, they may be considered for honor graduate - see below.***

The Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be determined based on the following:

- 1) Number of CDCS Rigor classes
- 2) GPA of CDCS Rigor classes
- 3) GPA in all CDCS Core classes
- 4) Cumulative Average, 100 point scale, of all CDCS Core classes

Courses of Rigor offered at CDCS are: Chemistry, Chemistry 2, Physics, Anatomy, Marine Biology, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Statistics, and any second, third or fourth year of Foreign Language.

Core classes include all courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language (HOPE GPA). Only courses taken in 9th-12th grades at CDCS will be included in the Rigor or GPA calculations.

The board reserves the right to adjust these qualifications if unexpected circumstances arise.

Honor Graduate Qualifications:

Students do *not* have to be a diploma student at CDCS, but they must be eligible to participate in CDCS graduation exercises. In general, a student who takes classes at CDCS regularly through high school is invited to participate in graduation. Final determination is made by the principal.

Students who are eligible to participate in CDCS graduation and have complied with the CDCS Code of Honor can be recognized as honor graduates. *The awards with High Honors and with Highest Honors are reserved for Diploma students of Coram Deo.*

Students with a 3.5 Overall GPA or higher will be recognized as graduates **with Honor**.
Students with a 3.75 overall GPA or higher will be recognized as graduates **with High Honor**.
Students with a 3.9 overall GPA or higher will be recognized as graduates **with Highest Honor**.

Other Honors:

Student who completes three or more classes in World Lit, Latin, Logic, Physics, Rhetoric, Philosophy, Greek, Astronomy will receive a Classical Studies certificate upon graduation.

Student who completes two CDCS Bible classes will receive a Biblical Studies certificate upon graduation.

We understand every student and situation is unique, but this is a list of what is generally required for CDCS to affirm that the diploma student took the highest level classes available to them. English- all 4 levels are taken at CDCS; History- 3 classes taken at CDCS; Math- 4 years taken at CDCS or until CDCS classes have been exhausted; Science- Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Anatomy taken at CDCS, and all elective requirements have been met.

FAQs

Assignment sheets

Students will receive assignments for each week or semester syllabus. Parents are responsible for reviewing their child's work and signing the sheet to indicate completion. If a child falls behind in his or her work, the teacher will correspond promptly with the parent by email or phone. Assignments may be modified slightly to meet the abilities and time constraints of the student. Work can be received early from the teacher in the event of the student missing class. Work can be made up and turned in late as well, but is subject to points being taken off.

Classroom Environment

Each classroom consists of 10-20 students. The teacher spends the day reviewing the previous week's assignments and dialoging with the students about the material. The teacher introduced the curriculum information for the next week and explains upcoming assignments. Students will have various quizzes and tests over material presented in class and in the curriculum. Each class will have finals at the end of each semester.

Help Outside of Class

Teachers are available for specific questions before and after class and at other appropriate times. Teachers are available daily through email. Teachers will be able to answer quick questions and give encouraging bits of advice, but not spend much time outside of class. Students and parents are to be considerate of teachers and their time. Remember, as home school parents, the responsibility of the child's education is ultimately yours. At times additional tutors might be required.

Grade Reports

We use Engrade to keep track of grades, and we will create an account for each student. You will create a login and password to view your child's grades. Coram Deo provides regular grade reports for students at the end of each semester. Typically, these come as email attachments that can be printed at the end of mid-semester (December) and at the end of the school year (May).

Coram Deo Classical School admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, scholarship programs, and other school-administered programs.



CORAM DEO CLASSICAL SCHOOL MODESTY STATEMENT AND CODE

Coram Deo Classical School (herein CDCS) desires to operate our school 'in the presence of God.' Meaning, all that we do or say is before the face of God, under His authority and for His glory. This includes modesty of words, deeds and appearances.

MODESTY (defined): An inner attitude of the heart motivated by love for God that seeks His glory through purity and humility in external words, actions, and appearances.

Romans 12: 1-2 states: "I urge you therefore brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."
