

Coram Deo Classical School Transcription Guidelines and Policies

When entering 8th and 9th grade, you and your student will need to select a student category from the list below.

□ Full Time Diploma Student

Student agrees to follow the CDCS guidelines for graduation and takes all classes at Coram Deo or takes pre-approved proctored or transcribed classes. Student must take a minimum of 2 core classes each year. This choice entitles your student to a report card and official CDCS transcript that is recognized by the GA Student Finance Commission (HOPE). Students may be considered for honor graduate status including valedictorian, salutatorian summa cum laude, magna cum laude and cum laude. Student is welcome to participate in the graduation service. *Additional fees may apply for proctored classes*.

□ Part Time Diploma Student

Student agrees to follow the CDCS guidelines for graduation but does not complete at least 18 credits at CDCS. This choice is typical of a transfer student to CDCS. Student must take a minimum of 2 core classes each year. This choice entitles your student to a report card and official CDCS transcript that is recognized by the GA Student Finance Commission (HOPE). Student may be considered for honor graduate status including summa cum laude, magna cum laude and cum laude. Student is welcome to participate in the graduation service. *Additional fees may apply for proctored classes or record transfer*.

□ Full Time Student

Student takes all or most classes at CDCS but obtains a transcript or diploma outside of CDCS. This choice entitles you to a report card or unofficial transcript available on Gradelink. Students are not considered for valedictorian, salutatorian, summa cum laude or magna cum laude. Student can be awarded cum laude if their cumulative GPA is 3.5 or higher. Student is invited to participate in the graduation service.

□ Part Time Student

Student can take a-la-carte classes on a space-available basis. This choice entitles you to a report card or unofficial transcript of the classes taken at CDCS and is available on Gradelink. Student may be invited to participate in the graduation service.

Special Circumstances may be considered for review by the CDCS Board.

If your student chooses to enter public high school with a CDCS transcript, the student might be required by the district to take end of course exams for the transcribed classes.

Graduation Honor Qualifications

Determination for Valedictorian, Salutatorian, and honor graduates are made based on Rigor, GPAs, and class standings at the end of the FIRST semester of the senior year (December 31).

Valedictorian/Salutatorian Qualifications:

Student must be a Full Time Diploma student (18 credit minimum) at Coram Deo Classical School (CDCS) and must have complied with the CDCS Code of Honor throughout high school. *Only students who meet this qualification are eligible to be considered for valedictorian or salutatorian; however, they may be considered for other honors - see below.*

The Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be determined based on the following:

- □ Number of CDCS rigor classes
- □ GPA of CDCS rigor classes
- □ GPA in all CDCS core classes
- □ Cumulative Average, 100 point scale, of all CDCS core classes

Courses of rigor offered at CDCS are: Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Physics, AP Physics, Environmental Science, Anatomy, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus, Statistics, and any second, third or fourth year of Foreign Language. Core classes include all courses in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language (HOPE GPA). Only courses taken in 9th-12th grades at CDCS will be included in the rigor or GPA calculations.

The board reserves the right to adjust these qualifications if unexpected circumstances arise.

Proctored Class Guidelines

All proctored classes must be approved in writing **before** each semester or summer school. These requests forms can be found on the <u>CDCS</u> website under documents.

Proctored Core Classes Taken at Home (\$25/semester)

(Science, English, History, Foreign Language, Health, Bible) Requirements per semester:

- □ Submit approval request form, syllabus, curriculum, and grade rationale prior to beginning course work. This should be done prior to the first day of the semester.
- Attend two meetings with parent, student, and adviser to take the midterm and final.
- □ 50% of the semester grade will come from a notebook of work submitted at midterm and final exam meetings.
- □ Two proctored tests:
 - o Mid-term provided and graded by the parent (20% of final grade)
 - o Final provided and graded by CDCS if class if offered at CDCS (30% of final grade)

When a student desires to obtain by proctor a credit for a core class that is offered by CDCS, the final will be provided and graded by CDCS staff and it will count for 30% of their semester average. A study guide for this final will be given to the student upon request. The final grade for the proctored class will be determined by preset percentages for parent grade (50%), midterm (20%), and final test (30%). See adviser for specifics.

<u>Each situation is unique</u>, so please discuss your student's needs with the adviser to finalize the requirements for proctored classes. Parents are required to attend proctoring appointments. There will be a \$25 fee for missed appointments without prior notification.

Transcripts are sent free of charge to colleges.

Additional transcripts are available for \$5 per copy.

Expedited transcripts might be available for a charge of \$20 each.

Please allow 10 business days when requesting a transcript.

Transcribed Class Guidelines

All transcribed classes must be approved in writing **before** each semester or summer school. This includes classes taken at other schools, music, & PE. These request forms can be found on the <u>CDCS website under documents</u>.

Transcribed Class taken with another instructor (\$0/semester)

(Online Class or traditional class at another accredited location or with approved tutor) Requirements per semester:

- □ Submit approval request form including the syllabus prior to beginning course work. This should be done prior to the first day of the semester.
- □ Submit form signed by instructor.
- □ Submit final grade issued by instructor or institution.

Transcribed Class requiring a log book (\$0/semester)

(PE, sports, drama, musical instrument- WITH an outside instructor or coach) Requirements per semester:

- □ Submit approval request form including the coach's/teacher's checklist prior to beginning the class.
- □ Participate in a performance, game, race, etc.
- □ Submit Log Book (75 hours for ½ credit, 150 hours for full credit) Located on the CDCS website under documents.
- ☐ Instructor submits numerical grade by the due date.

<u>Each situation is unique</u>, so please discuss your student's needs with the adviser to finalize the requirements for transcribed classes.

Additional transcripts are available for \$5 per copy.

Expedited transcripts might be available for a charge of \$20 each.

How do I set up my https://www.gafutures.org account?

Visit the website and click 'create an account'. There are many resources available to your student here. This is the website that most Universities in GA will use. It is considered a secure site. This site should be your first go to for questions. It has loads of information.

Do I need to enter my child's social security number and personal information? YES! This is the primary way your student will be tracked in the University system. Failure to be accurate could cost you delays in their senior year when filling out applications and trying to meet deadlines.

When do I set it up?

As soon as middle school, but it is helpful to have it done by your first transcription appointment in 9th grade.

When does the College timeline begin?

It begins as early as 7^{th} grade and can be located under the 'college planning' tab on GA futures site.

When to visit college campuses?

You can visit colleges any time during high school. It becomes more important in the spring of 11th grade. Check desired college websites for open houses.

When should my student take the PSAT?

Your student is encouraged to take the PSAT in 10th and or 11th grade. You will need to register with your local high school. It is offered in October.

When does my student take the SAT/ACT?

You should take the SAT/ACT by the end of 10th grade to determine which test to focus on with your student. Visit https://www.collegeboard.org/ or https://www.actstudent.org/ to register and get information. You may take these as many times as you desire.

What are college fairs?
